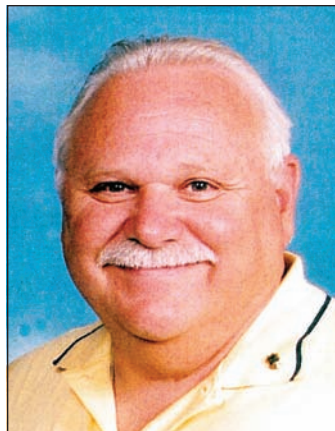
## Lydia Gutiérrez
