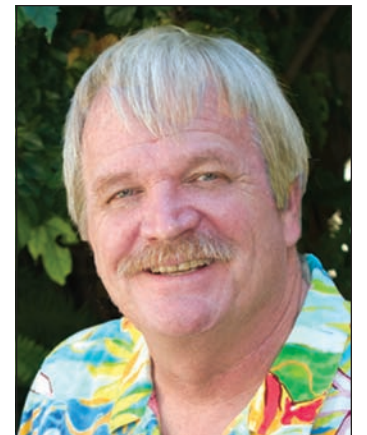
## Linda Marinkovich

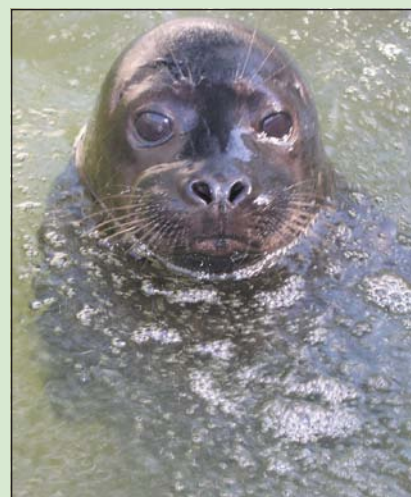
## Van Alexis Ulrich
