## **New Board Members Take Office November 1**

The council's election for board members was held October 25. Fourteen individuals were running for the 17 available positions so there will be three vacancies to be filled at the November meeting. ## **Angels Gate Park Master Plan**

Recently, the council voted to provide \$10,000 to help in the master plan process for Angels Gate Park. The Angels Gate Cultural Center (AGCC) is taking the lead on finally getting a master plan in place for the park. The AGCC has obtained various grants from public and private sources, as well as the Central San Pedro Neighborhood Council and is moving quickly so that \$2 million in state funds earmarked for Angels Gate can be used before it is lost.

## **Park Events, Filming Problem for Point Fermin Residents**

Those living around Point Fermin are inundated with traffic, parking, and noise problems when there are big events at the park. Recently, too, there has been a lot more filming activity in the area. Residents are understandably upset about the lack of proper notification and disruption created by these circumstances. For some time, the Coastal council has been asking the Department of Recreation and Parks and Councilwoman Janice Hahn to work with us in seeking solutions for the neighborhoods around Point Fermin. Progress has been slow, but we seem to finally have their attention. We'll keep you posted. If you have concerns, contact the Coastal council and be sure to let Councilwoman Hahn know, too. ## **Coastal Opposes Proposition R**

The Coastal council voted to oppose Proposition R, which is a city measure that would increase term limits for city council members from two terms (8 years) to three (12 years). The proposition also addresses various city ethics rules, in some cases making them stronger, in others, making them weaker. Coastal San Pedro joins the Central San Pedro, Northwest San Pedro, Wilmington, Harbor Gateway North, and Harbor Gateway South neighborhood councils in urging you to vote NO on Proposition R. ## **Ponte Vista Process Proceeds**

Councilwoman Hahn's Ponte Vista Advisory Group will be meeting at the Crowne Plaza Hotel on Thursday, November 9. The public is encouraged to attend. The Coastal council supports maintaining the current R-1 zoning which would result in a development of about 500 single-family homes. The developer wants 2,300 condos, housing a population of 7,300. The Coastal council believes the impact of a project this big, particularly on Western Avenue traffic, is too much for our community. Let us—and Councilwoman Hahn's advisory group—know if you agree.
